

Grissom High School
Dance I

A one-credit course designed for novice dancers to build proficiency through a strong foundation in dance elements. Students develop technical skills with a focus on alignment, nutrition, and injury prevention, and begin analyzing dance for artistic intent using basic knowledge of style, production, and cultural context.

How To Do Well In Class

- To respect others, you must first respect yourself.
 - Be prepared to begin class five minutes after the tardy bell.
 - Be wearing approved class attire with proper dance shoes.
 - Secure hair neatly.
 - Conduct oneself in a professional manner.
 - Keep talking to a minimum, and only when directed by Ms. Randolph.
- Take responsibility for results.
 - Practice repetition of good habits in technique and class etiquette.
 - Participate in one's education by communicating needs or concerns to Ms. Randolph.
 - Give your best effort, always.
 - Take initiative to improve. Set and track goals.
 - Request feedback.
- Create high expectations for oneself.
 - Value each day as an opportunity to learn and develop.
 - Require focus from oneself to listen and learn.
 - Do your best, without comparing one's class to others'.
 - Maintain an open mind that is willing to learn.

What Will You Learn In Class

- Self-motivation, self-expression and self-confidence
- Discipline, commitment and teamwork
- Following and executing directions

Class Materials

- Students are required to wear form-fitting athletic clothing that promotes movement for daily class. Details of the approved attire can be found below.
- Students are required to wear the appropriate footwear for class and performance(s), as determined by Ms. Randolph for each dance genre- Ballet (ballet flats), Contemporary (barefoot or socks), Jazz (black and/or skin-tone jazz shoes), and Hip Hop (black canvas high-top sneakers).
- For performances, female students will need skin-tone transition dance tights. ALL students will need skin-tone color undergarments to wear under costumes. Male students must wear a dance belt for daily class and performance(s). Additional materials may be required for performance(s), and that information will be communicated to students and parents as soon as that is known to Ms. Randolph.
- Students are required to tightly secure hair in a middle-part, low ponytail or low bun. For students with shorter hair, an agreed upon style can be decided between the student and Ms. Randolph. Students with bangs are expected to secure them away from the face. Students are not required to straighten or curl their hair and can wear their natural texture. Protective styles are also permitted. *Beads or other decorative hair accessories are not permitted to be worn in the hair, as it can present the possibility for injury.

Dressing Out

Every student is expected to dress out daily, unless otherwise notified by Ms. Randolph. Please review the welcome packet for information on approved attire for class. Failing to dress out in the approved attire is subject to the demerit system. Please change clothes in the approved bathroom ONLY. You will have 5 minutes from the tardy bell to dress out and be in your position to begin class.

Class Participation

Each student is expected to perform to their highest level of potential, daily. Each student will be evaluated on their personal ability and progress. Your behavior within class is imperative as we collectively strive for a professional, respectful learning environment. Behavior including, but not limited to, tardiness, improper attire, excessive talking, rudeness or disruptive behavior will be subject to the demerit system, with disciplinary action implemented.

Always communicate to Ms. Randolph any reason you may not be able to participate in class as expected. Ex: injuries, or illness. If you must sit out more than one class, you must present a written excuse from the parent. After two classes, you must present a written excuse from a physician.

Make-up Work Policy

It is the students' responsibility to approach Ms. Randolph for make-up work. This includes worksheets, projects, tests, and class showings. A student has 2 days for every 1 day they were absent, to make up their work. This is allowed for up to 2 weeks. Ms. Randolph will NOT accept make-up work beyond the 2-week deadline for credit.

Performances

All students are required to participate in ALL technical rehearsals, dress rehearsals and performances. Performances are a large part of your 4th nine weeks grade and 2nd semester grade. Performances are an opportunity to demonstrate how you have progressed throughout the school year. All rehearsals and performances are test grades, weighted at 60% of your final grade.

IMPORTANT GRADE INFORMATION FOR PERFORMANCE ELIGIBILITY

All students must maintain an overall "C" average in four core classes, as well as an "A" average in dance for performance eligibility.

Class Uniforms



Athletic Top

Dancers must wear a form-fitted athletic top to daily class and non-costumed rehearsals. Straps/Sleeves must align with school dress code.



Athletic Pant

Dancers must wear a form-fitted athletic pant to daily class and non-costumed rehearsals. Pants must be tight at the ankle, therefore no flare leggings or wide-leg sweatpants. No shorts.



Sock

Dancers may wear socks in contemporary class and performance, when approved. Socks must be solid color and thin-knit. No socks that are thick, fuzzy, or wool.



Ballet Shoe

Dancers must have skin-tone, canvas ballet shoes for ballet class and performance. Ballet shoes must be split sole.



Jazz Shoe

Dancers must have black leather jazz shoes for jazz class and performance. Jazz shoes must be split sole.



High-Top Sneaker

Dancers must have black, high-top sneakers for hip hop class and performance. Sneakers must have white laces.
